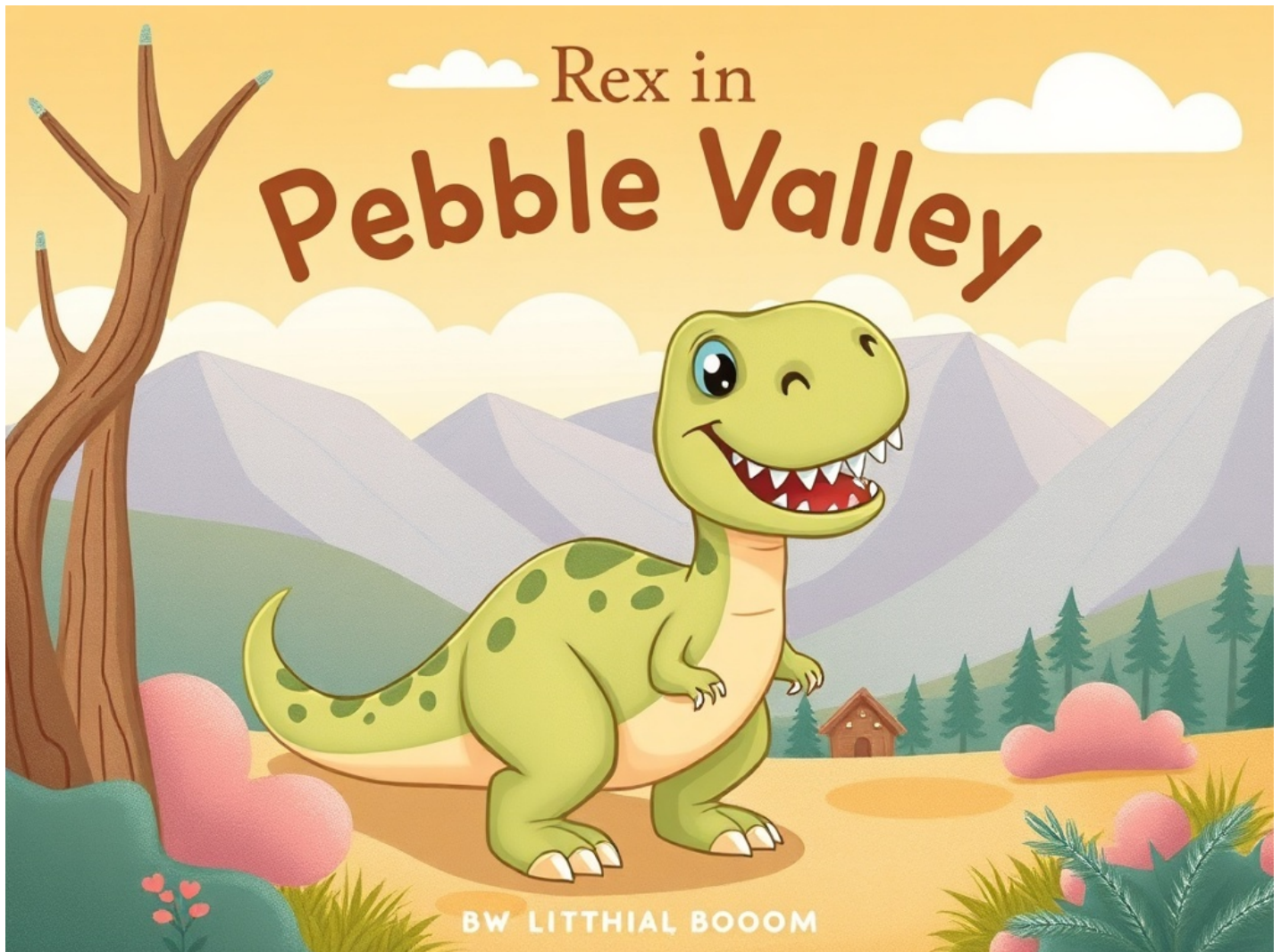


# The Dinosaur Who Learned to Share
